MONTREAL'S QUARTIER DES LUMIÈRES EARNS THE WORLD'S HIGHEST EVER "FITWEL COMMUNITY" RATING

Montreal, February 6th, 2020 – Montreal's Quartier des lumières can be referred to as the real estate development with the strongest focus on well-being and on global health in the World, according to the Center for Active Design, in New York, who has just awarded a "Three Stars Fitwel Community" certification to the new neighborhood developed by MACH and design firm Lemay on the former Radio-Canada site in Montreal. It is the only neighborhood in Canada to hold this certification; moreover, it was also granted the highest international score in this assessment.

Clearly, MACH's approach to diversity and overall well-being in this giant 20 acres (765,000 sq. ft.) <u>project</u>, which comprises social housing, office space, local retailers, vast parks, public areas, rental apartments and condos, has proven to be successful. The founding vision, now embodied under the Fitwel seal, will steer the project team on the path to the utmost standards in overall health.
